

# **MANHATTAN SHORT**

# Film Festival is coming to Cass City.

This Film Festival screens simultaneously across the world during a one-week period, where attendees vote for Best Film and Best Actor awards at each participating venue. Every short film selected will automatically become qualified for the Oscars of 2024. Not only do MANHATTAN SHORT filmgoers get the chance to watch the cream of the crop of this year's international short films, every audience

votes for their favorite film and actor. This year, The Cass Theater has graciously partnered with us so we can experience the film festival on the big screen! ## **Memory Maker Kits**

Thanks to a generous grant from the Pinney Foundation, Rawson Memorial Library is adding eight Memory Maker Kits for patrons to check out. Each kit has items that engage as many senses as possible and that encourage memories/remembering. These kits are geared toward patrons or their loved ones with dementia, autism, ADHD, or anxiety. They also may be used for those who have had strokes or other impairments to aid in increasing their sensory and fine motor skills.

The Memory Maker Kits provide opportunities for adults and those who care for them to reminisce which generates joy, comfort, and engagement, enhancing their quality of life. The kits give family members new and creative ways of interacting with their loved ones.

The kits cover eight topics: homemaking, handyman, the great outdoors, farms, and one for each season of the year. Each kit includes a puzzle, an I-Spy sensory bottle with a laminated card of items to find, a DVD plus activity/discussion cards, and a fidget blanket, and the items are contained in a labeled tote bag. Kits may be checked out for 2 weeks.

Also to The Cass Theatre for awarding all our program participants with a free movie pass. # Use MeL's eResources as you go Back To School!

In addition to MeL's NoveList Plus, Hobbies & Crafts Reference Center, PebbleGo, and LearningExpress Library, another great eResource is Britannica School. This database is an interactive digital encyclopedia with information specifically geared towards school-age children grades 3-12 that allows you to choose elementary, middle, or high school reading levels.

Here you can find 130,000+ fact-checked articles, 100,000+ images and videos, and 1,100+ biographies in an engaging easy-to-use format. Additional content includes journals and magazines, related eBooks and primary sources, and editor recommended websites. Teachers also appreciate that this site includes Lexile ranges and aligns with the curricular standards for Michigan's Department of Education. Students have the ability to choose the read-aloud function, or to translate the articles to over 80 languages as well. Another cool feature is that you can download the Google Chrome extension which enhances your web browsing by directing you to Britannica School if any information matches your searches.

How do you begin using *Britannica School*? Connect to MeL through our website (www.rawsonlibrary.org), open up the eResources tab, click on *Britannica School*, and begin your search. No need to create a username and password unless you want to save your favorites for future reference. You may also print, email, or use citations provided for your projects. We would be glad to help you at the library with any other information you need in the many subjects areas you are learning. Have a great school year!

#### **Library Renovations**

The Rawson Library Board decided that it is time to spruce up the library with an interior update. Our facility was last renovated in 1997 and has weathered time well, but daily use and wear and tear have begun to show. We are working with Library Design Associates, a company with over 40 years of experience specializing in libraries, to redecorate the library. The Board voted to use funds from our savings to have the building painted, carpeted, and a few modifications made to the layout. During the renovation process, it will be necessary to be closed because everything will be moved into the Pinney Room so that painting and carpeting can be completed. We are expecting this to take place in the later part of September, but the dates have

not been finalized and depend on material delivery dates. As soon as we know the specific dates we'll let you know. At that time we encourage all readers to take out LOTS of books to keep you well supplied while we are closed. Petal N Bean has graciously invited us to host our regular programs in the front room of their restaurant we have great neighbors! So as you read through this newsletter regarding our upcoming events, remember that we may need to change the location to Petal N Bean. 


