Voters to Consider Operating Millage Renewal

If you are a registered voter in Elmwood, Elkland, or Novesta Township please be aware that the library's .75 operating millage will be on the ballot on August 6. This is not new money, it is a renewal. Library Board Trustees are requesting that voters continue funding library operations for the next twelve years. The revenue that millage monies generate supports the general operation of the library and helps fund events for all ages such as story times, summer reading programs, seed library, book club, cookbook club; the purchase of books, magazines, online materials; reference services; homebound delivery; utilities and so much more.

During 2023, Rawson Library had 23,940 visits, offered 187 events that were attended by 3,500+ people of all ages. Over 18,000 physical and electronic materials were checked out. Our computers were used 1,400+ times and our WiFi 7,800 times. Countless people were helped with copies, faxing, scanning, notary services by our helpful staff. This is your millage money at work!
