

Author Visit & Book Signing

Wildlife Conservation Officer John Borkovich is the author of *Wildlife 911: On Patrol* a compilation of incidents and stories from his work protecting and preserving Michigan wildlife and natural resources. He will share stories and have a book signing at Rawson Library on Monday, September 16 at 1:30 p.m.

A graduate of Michigan State University, John was hired as a Michigan Conservation Officer in 1985. He worked as part of the DNR Firearms Transition Team, a firearms instructor, a Field Training Officer for recruiting conservation officers, an instructor at the Conservation Officer Police Academy held at the Michigan State Police headquarters in Lansing, as well as an adjunct professor at St. Clair County Community College in the criminal justice department. He has received many awards and accommodations: The Shikar Safari International Wildlife Officer of the Year Award and the National Wildlife Turkey Federation Michigan Officer of the Year.


