Summer Reading Program

Young Adult and ADULT Summer Reading Program 2021:

Rawson Library invites you to join us in "Tails and Tales"- The YA and Adult Summer Reading program of 2021.

This is a very simple program, not requiring much time or effort on the part of the participant other than reading. For each book read during the summer, the participant fills out a small slip of paper that requests the Title and Author of the book as well as a rating on how well they like the book. These slips are turned in when the books are returned and then entered in a drawing to win an Amazon gift card.

Summer Reading Programs are just around the corner and new things are happening! Rawson is introducing a new Summer Reading Program format called "Read and Bead". This program will be kicked off with a sign up event on Tuesday, June 8th from 10-12pm. Kids aged Kindergarten—6th grade will read and record their minutes (or have a grown-up help them track time) on a reading log and then turn those minutes in for brag tags and beads of varying colors, shapes, and designs to decorate and personalize their very own necklace. Each minute read can count toward a bead earned.

Another new addition to Summer Reading program is the "Puppy Club". This program is for ages 0-4 and gives little ones the opportunity to participate in early literacy activities along with the older children. Grown-ups are given a reading log with activities that focus on early literacy, brain or motor development. For each

activity completed, kids can color in a puppy on the sheet. Once all the puppies are colored in, the family can visit the library to select a prize.

Summer reading programs are designed to encourage elementary-aged children to keep reading during summer vacation. Preventing the "summer slide" continues to be the main objective of summer reading programs. For many families with elementary-aged children, the public library is the only community space available during the summer months where they can access free educational and cultural enrichment activities and programs.

The benefits of summer reading programming for children:


- Children are motivated to read.
- Children develop positive attitudes about reading, books, and the library.
- Children maintain their reading skills during summer vacation.

• Children have access to experiences that further their sense of discovery.

• Children have access to experiences through which they can learn to work cooperatively.

All participants are invited to join us as we wrap up our summer reading program with a celebration in the park. This picnic will be held at the Cass City Recreational Park on July 22nd.

Along with these new programs, we will be having various other fun events including offering the chance to vote to see a librarian get a pie in the face! Stay tuned for more information about what we have planned for this summer! It's going to be a blast!



Rawson Library Offers

Mobile Hotspots and Chromebooks for Check Out

Rawson Memorial Library received CARES Act grant funds, administered through the Institute of Museum and Library Services and the Library of Michigan, to purchase hotspots and Chromebooks so that members of our community who do not have home Wi-Fi or a home computer may access the internet.

The mobile hotspots can be used in your home to connect up to 10 Wi-Fi

enabled devices to the internet with unlimited data on a fast, secure network. Our hotspots rely on mobile broadband service from Sprint and we can check whether or not you have coverage in your area.

Additionally, six Chromebooks are available for check out. Chromebooks offer a simple way of getting online and using Google services. You can check out both a hotspot and Chromebook to access the internet in the comfort of your own home. Stop in today and check them out!

Rawson Library Is Plugging Into Solar

Rawson Memorial Library’s Board and staff are pleased to announce the receipt of funds from Frank and Val Kemp for the installation of a solar panel system at the Library.

Frank and Val Kemp have been wonderful supporters of Rawson Library since they moved to Cass City in 1998. They purchased a large Victorian home on Seeger Street and opened the McGregory Manor Bed and Breakfast where they hosted guests from across the globe—India, Turkey, Japan, Sweden, England, Scotland, Austria and Germany.

In 2005, Frank was appointed to the library board and he served until 2018. Meanwhile, Val volunteered to read at story times and became known as the “Awesome Rawson Reader”. She created Read Around the World, an after-school program for children held at the library. Each week a different country was ‘visited’; children learned about the country, sampled some of its foods and created a craft that represented something fun from that land.

In 2009, the Kemps closed the McGregory Manor and later moved to Shelby Township in order to be closer to family. Val continues to live there. Frank passed June 14, 2020 after months of battling the effects of strokes and then contracting COVID-19. He was 91.

The Kemps generously donated the funds for the solar system in order to remove the burden of the library’s electric bill, which is currently \$400+ a month. This will allow more millage dollars to be spent on programming, books, and other resources that can be enjoyed by the whole community. Besides the financial aspect, we are pleased to utilize solar energy and make a positive impact on our environment.

When the project is complete, Val will be here to flip the switch, and we hope that you will join us that day to thank her and to celebrate this wonderful update to our beloved Rawson Library. Watch the Cass City Chronicle and our Facebook page for the announcement of this event.

Rawson Library Receives ALA Grant

Rawson Memorial Library received \$3,000 through the American Library Association’s (ALA) *Libraries Transforming Communities: Focus on Small and Rural Libraries* initiative. The funding enables libraries to lead community engagement efforts and may be used to cover a range of expenses including collection development and technology purchases. Over 500 grants were awarded nationwide; 14 grants were awarded to Michigan libraries including Rawson Memorial Library.

This grant will allow Rawson Library staff to partner with Josh Prusik, Cass City Community Development Fellow, to host

conversations with our Village officials about resources, educational opportunities, and technology training. It includes the purchase of books and other publications plus three HP Chromebooks, an Owl Pro 360 camera, and a Zoom Business License for hosting meetings and trainings. Additional conversations will be offered to members of Cass City community groups and individuals interested in the future of the Village.

We are grateful for the *Libraries Transforming Communities* grant which offers us the opportunity to work collaboratively with community members to address issues for the betterment of Cass City.
