# Lyle Clarke Receives Prestigious Award

The Michigan Library Awards is the Michigan library community's very own version of the Academy Awards, the Emmys, the Grammys, and the Tonys!

The Michigan Library Awards are awarded annually and are considered the state's highest honors within the library community. The awards celebrate the excellence. accomplishments, dedication and service of library staff, trustees and supporters in the Michigan library community. Each recipient was chosen through peer review for outstanding achievements within specific categories: Rising Star, Frances H. Pletz Award for Excellence in Service to Youth, Heart of a Champion, Support Staff of the Year, Legislator of the Year, Public Librarian of the Year, Academic Librarian of the Year, School Librarian of the Year, Lifetime Achievement Award, the State Librarian's Citations of Excellence and the State Librarian's Excellence Award.

We are pleased to announce that Lyle Clarke, President of the Rawson Memorial Library Board was selected as the winner of the Heart of a Champion Award! This award recognizes those who have shown an exceptional commitment to libraries or the library profession through continued advocacy and supporting or providing funding for their local library.

His nominators have high praise for Lyle:

"Lyle's experiences have been so beneficial to his trustee position with Rawson Memorial District Library. In 1988, Lyle retired from the Cass City Public Schools after 35 years. He was soon appointed trustee to the library as the Novesta Township representative. In 1996, the library board initiated a building With Lyle's expansion. lifetime experiences he gladly led the way to get the project done. He has served on the board for almost 30 years and is currently the president. His unwavering dedication and support to the library and community deserves his nomination for this award."

"After 29 years on the Rawson Memorial Library Board, most of which serving as President, Lyle has overseen a major construction project, encouraged advances in technology, and supported three Library Directors, one during a pandemic. He brought Board members together to educate other elected officials about the library, helped to bring in additional revenue, and has supported the staff."



What makes Lyle stand out as a Heart of a Champion is that month after month, year after year, he has faithfully served Rawson Memorial Library by being present, sharing his knowledge, providing encouragement, and advocating in the community. His steady presence has provided continuity to the Board and the library. As a champion he has defended the policies of the library, supported the staff during difficult times and celebrated with us when challenges have been overcome, and he has been a steadfast advocate to ensure that Cass City has a quality library that serves everyone.
