Michigan eLibrary Supporting Michigan Libraries

Have you tried MeL, our free Interlibrary Loan service?

MeL is the statewide resource-sharing project that makes books and some media from libraries around Michigan available to patrons of participating libraries. Over 20 million items are available from over 400 libraries statewide. For items that you cannot find on our shelves, you might want to try Michigan eLibrary's catalog!

So, how exactly does it work?

It's easy! For patrons with a valid library card, all you need to do is start your search through the MeL link found on our website. (You may also give us a call, email, or ask for help at the desk.) If an item is available, you can follow the prompts to make a request, and the item will be delivered here to our library. You will then be contacted when your item has arrived and is available to be picked up at the desk. When you have finished with an item, you simply return it to Rawson Memorial, and we will send the item back to the lending library.

So, is there anything new with MeL?

Yes, some updates have been made since the beginning of the year, and now the loan times for the items you check out through MeL have been extended. Books had a 3 week checkout period, but now the length of the loan to patrons is 4 weeks with the option of one 4 week renewal. Audio visuals had a loan period of 1 week, but now the checkout period is 2 weeks, with still no renewals on these items.

Many of our library patrons have already been using MeL. We would be happy to help you access this great resource as well. Happy reading!
